I thank you most sincerely for your contributions to the broad efforts made to ensure that the DoC evolved from a noble vision to a transformative force-for-good – one that has had a profoundly positive impact on the global oil industry. Nigeria plays a leading and inspirational role on the African continent in oil and gas affairs and cooperation.

Nigeria is consistently regarded as one of the most admired and respected members of the OPEC family, particularly in the realm of consensus-building. Many giants of Nigerian public service have been responsible for this successful relationship. Today is an important opportunity to reflect on their legacy and give thanks for the ways in which they have molded our Organization.

I firmly believe that the partnership between OPEC and Nigeria can continue to flourish over the next 50 years. In undertaking this noble endeavour, we will continue to rely on your full support.


Mr. President, on the occasion of **Nigeria's 60 year anniversary of independence on 1 October 2020**, you said to the Nigerian people,
